Top Scams of 2014 as reported by our consumers

The Grandparent Scam – You receive a call from someone pretending to be a relative or close friend. They use the name of a real relative/friend and know your name as well. They say they're in trouble and need financial help. After you send money you discover it was a scammer doing a good acting job to steal your money.

Phantom Debt Collector – You receive a call from someone claiming you owe a debt with an offer to settle the balance or face dire consequences. The caller may use threatening language to get you to pay right away, and will



ask for you to pay via money wire or pre-paid debit card. The debt may even be real or one that you paid off in the past. Legitimate debt-collectors must abide by the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act, and cannot use threatening language or call before 8:00 AM, or after 9:00 PM.

"Calling Yourself" Scam – You hear the phone ringing but when you look down at your caller ID you see your own name and number displayed. You're calling yourself! In other cases the number displayed is that of a local business, neighbor, or even the police dept. Scammers are using caller ID spoofing technology to impersonate phone numbers to trick you into answering the phone. The call is usually a robo call attempting to get your personal and financial information.

"Microsoft" Computer Repair Scam — You get a call or pop-up on your computer claiming to be from Microsoft, Windows, or another recognizable computer company, stating you have a problem on your computer. They ask for access to your computer so they can fix it. Instead they install malware on your computer, start stealing your personal information, and then ask you to pay them for doing it! In some cases they have even frozen users out of their computers or encrypted their files, holding them ransom until payment is received.

Sweepstakes Scam – This was almost our top scam because we see this one every single day. You're told you won a contest or the lottery or even the Publisher's Clearinghouse sweepstakes. All you have to do to claim your prize is pay some fees or taxes first. They may even send you a phony check to help you pay the fees. Remember- winning is free and you don't win sweepstakes you don't enter!

The IRS/Back-Taxes Scam – Close to 20% of all our scam calls in 2014 involved the IRS scam. You receive a call or voicemail from someone claiming to be and IRS or other U.S. Government agent. They threaten to arrest you for overdue taxes unless you pay them right-away via a wire transfer or prepaid debit card. The IRS will never call you and ask for payment in this manner!

What You Can Do:

- Don't be pressured into making fast decisions.
- Take time to research the organization. Check them out on bbb.org, search online, etc.
- Never provide your personal information (address, date-of-birth, banking information, ID numbers) to people you do not know.
- · Don't click on links from unsolicited email or text messages.
- If you are unsure about a call or email that claims to be from your bank, utility company, etc., call the business from the number on your bill or the back of your credit card.
- Never send money by wire transfer or prepaid debit card to someone you don't know or haven't met in person.
- Never send money for an emergency situation unless you've been able to verify the emergency.
